Devotional Guide

Jesus Eats with Sinners at Matthew's house

Scripture Reading: Luke 5: 27 - 32

Sermon Notes

Monday: Read Luke 5: 27 - 29

Matthew (who was also named Levi) left a lucrative, though probably dishonest tax-collecting business to follow Jesus. Then he responded as Jesus would want all his followers to do. He held a reception for his fellow tax collectors and other notorious “sinners” so they could meet Jesus too. Levi, who left behind a material fortune in order to gain a spiritual fortune, was proud to be associated with Jesus.

Tuesday: Read Luke 5: 30 - 32

The Pharisees wrapped their sin in respectability. They made themselves appear good by publicly doing good deeds and pointing at the sins of others. Jesus chose to spend time not with these proud, self-righteous religious leaders, but with people who sensed their own sin and knew they were not good enough for God. In order to come to God, we must repent; and in order to renounce our sin, we must first acknowledge it.

Wednesday: Read Luke 5: 27 - 32 (*Let us learn about Matthew*)

Matthew was a Jew who was appointed by the Romans to be the area's tax collector. He collected taxes from the citizens as well as from merchants passing through town. Tax collectors were expected to take a commission on the taxes they collected, but most of them overcharged and kept the profits. Thus, tax collectors were hated by the Jews because of their reputation for cheating and because of their support of Rome.

Thursday: Read Luke 5: 27 - 32

When Jesus called Matthew to be one of his disciples, Matthew got up and followed, leaving a lucrative career. When God calls you to follow or obey him, do you do it with as much abandon as Matthew? Sometimes the decision to follow Christ requires difficult or painful choices. Like Matthew, we must decide to leave behind those things that would keep us from following Christ.

Friday: Read Luke 5: 27 - 32

When Jesus visited Matthew, he hurt his own reputation. Matthew was cheating the people, but Jesus found and changed him. We should not be afraid to reach out to people who are living in sin—God's message can change anyone. God is concerned for all people, including the sinful and hurting ones. The Christian life is not a popularity contest! Following Jesus' example, we should share the Good News with the poor, immoral, lonely, and outcast, not just the rich, moral, popular, and powerful.

This week's devotional guide was taken from the Life Application Bible.
